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ADDENDUM ET CORRIGENDUM TO TWO INSCRIPTIONS FROM STRATONIKEIA

- 1) Addendum to no. 1030 from Stratonikeia: I talked to the former owners of this inscribed block of marble. They told me that it was stolen from their house together with other antique architectural blocks of marble. They also told me that they have had no connection to Lagina (Turgut) at all, but that they had a vineyard in Stratonikeia. Hence, it is clear that this inscribed block originates from Stratonikeia, as I have always suggested, from the vineyard of the former owners, and not from Lagina (Turgut).
- 2) Corrigendum to no. 1549 A and B: Since the inscribed block has the same kind of marble and has the same workmanship as the marble blocks of the bouleuterium, I had assumed that the block comes from the walls of the bouleuterium. However, on the block there are no dowel holes or traces of them on any sides of it. Hence, it is clear that the block under discussion was not a building block, and does not belong to the bouleuterium. It must have been placed in the stoa on the north side of the bouleuterium, where it has been found.
