→ IF you have a working knowledge of German at level B1 to B2 (according to the CEFR) and would like to improve your German language skills while learning new approaches to the Ancient Studies;

→ IF you would like to meet other classical scholars and PhD students and discuss ideas and projects;

→ IF you would like to get acquainted with an important provincial city founded by the Romans;

→ IF you wish to experience the warm and friendly town that is the modern city of Cologne
