A DEDICATION TO AUGUSTUS

The inscription presented here was found and copied in the village Karanfilli located north of Alabanda in Caria and is now preserved in the Aydın Museum. The text is engraved on a



marble quadrangular altar with mouldings at top and bottom. Height 0.475, width 0.29, thickness 0.27; letter-height 0.017.

Ή κώμη ή Ολυνδωνδρέων (?) Αὐ-4 τοκράτορι Καίσαρι θεοῦ υἰῷ θεῷ Σεβαστῷ.

"The village of Olyndondra (? dedicated this) to the god *Imperator Caesar Divi f. Augustus*."

The village, which seems to have been situated in the territory of Alabanda, has not yet been attested. From the genitive plural Ολυνδωνδρεων one could derive the nominative of an ethnicon Ολυνδωνδρεύς from a

toponym Ολυνδωνδρα. The existence of the name Ω νδρα $(\Omega$ νδρεύς)² in Caria leads one to speculate that Ολυνδωνδρα could be a combination of two toponyms: Ολυνδ-³ and Ω νδρα. However, the possibility that the village had two names, i.e., Ολυνδων Δρεων, cannot be ruled out.

The inscription is to be dated between 27 B.C., the year when Octavianus received the title Augustus,⁴ and 14 A.D.
