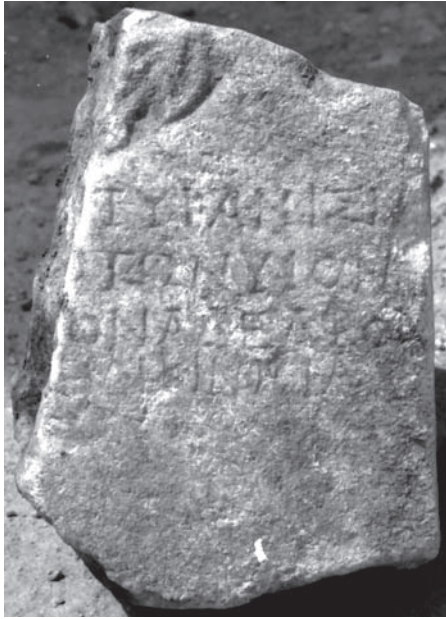

## SOME FRAGMENTARY INSCRIPTIONS FROM LYDIA

**1.** Korubaşı (E of Charakipolis). Right, lower part of a marble stele. A wreath above the inscription is partly preserved. It was discovered in 1998. Its present location is unknown. H. 0.23, W. 0.16, Th. 0.07, letters 0.015 m. Date: Roman imperial period.



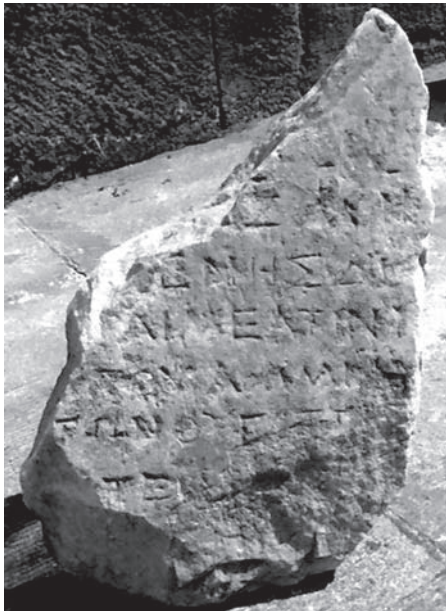

Line 2: On the form ἐ]ατῶν (= ἐ]αυτῶν) see G. Petzl, *Arkeoloji Dergisi* II, 1994, 146 with bibliography.

Line 4: Its shallow script leads one to suppose that this line is a later addition.

The deceased is here honoured by his parents, by his brother or sister, and probably by his wife Licinnia.

For the name Τυραν(ν)ίς see *TAM* V,1, 7 and G. Petzl, *EA* 15, 1990, 64–5, no. 23.



**2.** Gökçeören (formerly Menye [Maionia]). Right, lower piece of a marble stele. It was photographed in 1996. Its present location is unknown. No measurements. Date: Roman imperial period.

Ammia, the deceased, is here honoured by her parents.

**3.** Bedeller (SW of Hyrkanis). Piece of a marble block which was found in 1997 (now in the Manisa Museum). H. 0.43, W. 0.27, Th. 0.175, letters 0.035 m. Date: Roman imperial period.

Line 1: Either Στράτα (cf. *TAM* V,1, 25–6) or a misspelling for Στρατο-  
 [νίκη] or Στρατό[νικος] (for a similar occurrence in this region see  
 P. Herrmann – H. Malay, *New Documents from Lydia* [in print], no. 64:  
 Στρατανείκη [Maionia]).

Line 2: The deceased had a name ending in -νᾶς (e.g. Μηνᾶς, Φιλωνᾶς  
 etc.).

Line 4: Probably Μοσχᾶ[ς or Μοσχά[ριον].



4. Doğuca (W of Thyateira). Piece of the lid of a marble  
 sarcophagus. It was discovered in 1997. Its actual location  
 is unknown. H. 0.57, W. 0.99, Th. 0.06, letters 0.08 m. Date:  
 Roman imperial period.

### Özet

Yazıda, 1996–1998 yıllarında Lydia bölgesindeki Charakipolis, Maionia, Hyrkanis ve Thyateira antik kentlerine yakın köylerde bulunmuş olan 4 adet mezar yazıtı parçası ele alınmaktadır.
