Workflow:

Individual presentations of 20 minutes on assigned seals and discussion of 10 minutes.

Division of students in three groups. Each group studies the topic further and produces a common presentation on two general issues: 'Byzantine culture through seals' and 'Byzantine society through seals', based on remarks and discussion regarding their individual presentations and on bibliography from the library of the University.

The three groups present their findings on Friday and exchange their views.

During the individual study sessions, the instructor remains at the room and is available for advice. The students may consult the library or have group sessions (live and online) discussing their progress and findings.

Each three-hour session includes a break of 15 minutes. Each two-hour session includes a break of 5–10 minutes.

The students may consult the library during study sessions or at the end of the day. Between 17:00-20:00, they will have to be accompanied by a member of the Cologne team. Please do not forget to have an ID card on you.

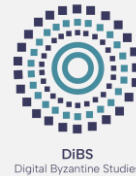

USEFUL INFORMATION

- Many train/metro/tram lines function throughout the night. Tickets can be procured by the vending machines at each station. Some lines are underground (mainly in their section through the city centre) and some completely overground (like trams). The main station for the University is called Universität (2-3 minutes walking) with line 9, and Weißhausstrasse or Eifelwall with line 18 (10 minutes walking). During the day, trains usually run every 10-15 minutes. Buses run irregularly, although there is always a timetable.
- From Düsseldorf airport there are several trains going to Cologne, at least three per hour. The journey is not long and takes in average 40-50 minutes. The ticket costs around 12 Euros. You may choose trains whose line name starts with RE (Regional), not IC or ICE. The latter ones are more expensive and will only shorten your route by 10 minutes. You may take with the same ticket any RE train going to Cologne, but make sure not to take any IC or ICE train, because you will get a fine.
- The main train stations of Cologne are the Hauptbahnhof (Hbf) and the Messe/Deutz. Smaller regional train stations include the Bahnhof (Bf) Süd (10 minutes walking from the University) and Bf Ehrenfeld. Many of the RE trains stopping at the central stations continue their journey to some of the smaller ones.
- Should you experience any problem you may contact me at +4915221677621 or +306974836226 (also WhatsApp). If you have an EU mobile number roaming is now free, so you may call or use your data free of charge.
- If you already have Eduroam, you will normally have access with it in the campus. Anyway, you will be provided with codes to access the University's Wi-fi.
- Do not forget to visit the Cathedral of Cologne and the Roman-German Museum at Cäcilienstrasse 46 near Neumarkt. Some of you may wish to visit the Church of St Pantaleon where empress Theophano, niece of emperor Nikephoros II Phokas (963-969) and wife to the German emperor Otto II (973-983), is buried.
